AOPA's latest statistics

According to the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association, the United States, as of 2005, has 5,270 public use airports and 14, 584 private use airports. There are 586, 304 pilots in the United States and of those, 5,958 reside in Iowa.

The 2005 Nall Report shows that there were 6.7 percent fewer total accidents in 2004 than in 2003, and fatal accidents declined by 7.1 percent. The decrease in General Aviation accidents in 2004 continued a downward trend of overall and fatal General Aviation accident rates, which are down about 25 percent over the past 10 years. This reduction in accidents continued even as the FAA estimates that GA flight hours have increased by about 200,000 hours in each of the last three years.
